HAL THOMA'S 1968 CHEVROLET CAMARO R/S

This beautiful 1968 Camaro R/S belongs to Hal Thomas. It is painted black with white "SS" stripes. The interior is also black. The engine is a 350 Chevy that is completed with a March pulley set up, and topped off with an Edelbrock 750 carburetor. The firepower comes from an electronic ignition and the fuel is delivered using a Holley electronic fuel pump. To get the exhaust out Hal has Doug's headers along with some Flowmaster super 44 mufflers. Hal gets through the gears with a Trimec 5 speed trans and a hydraulic clutch. The suspension has rack and pinion steering with power assisted disk front brakes and drum rear. It has a GM 10 bolt rear end with 373 gears and traction bars. To help out the suspension it has Hotchkis sway bars. If you get a chance, check this car out up close, it is nice!

Who is John Bean? He was the owner of the Bean Spray Pump Company. They manufactured the piston pump to spray insecticides on many of the fruit orchards in the mid 1880's. (Stay with me) In 1928 the bean company purchased Anderson-Barngrover Company & Sprague Sales, and changed the name to F.M.C., Food Machinery Corporation (still with me). The United States War Department in 1941 asked them to design and build 200 each LVT-A-1. Some of you may ask what this is. It's a landing vehicle tracked, the A means armored and the 1 means first generation. This is where the Dave & Larry Trophy Presentation (Shawna gets all the trophy sponsors together), The Henry & Janene Old Fart Store, The Jeanne Registration Tables, and The Surfer Dave DJ Booth are located. 

Next year (the weekend after Show and Go) we hope to see more Old Farts come to Highgrove Day and bring the whole family.



Folks, like I have said before, I really enjoy this low keyed show. I hope you did as well.




Brad Seaverson, Old Fart #384.



"How to lose a month, the hard way"

What a wonderful thing to do, to say hello. For those of you that don't know me, I'm the guy with the silly Red, White & Blue Ranchero...I'm 55 years old and have smoked for over 40. I learned long ago how to care for cars, about required maintenance and what happens when not followed with some degree of regularity. This story is more about the learning curve, the wake-up call with the same ideals when applied to us as people. I wish this were shorter, but what can I say, was rather a long month...... Please read on

My story starts early July...I remember spending the 4th with a guy dear to my heart (thanks, Don L.), had an enjoyable time, watched fireworks & talked a lot about years long since gone. I got up the next couple of mornings, had a pleasant time working with a new customer on his tri-5 Chevy wagon... was hot & muggy that whole week, finished my work week, July 7th and was closing up shop & loading stuff in my truck for the upcoming weekend - next thing I remember, I was on the ground in my customer's garage with him asking what was wrong, myself wondering what just happened. As I recall, instantly, like the flip of a switch. I hurt about everywhere, was as sweaty as I remember ever being. My customers (A special Thank you to Jim & Kiki R.) took me into their house to get some water, with them being limited to only the information I chose to share. Wonderful A/C, a few cool, damp compresses, and the better part of an hour later, I chose to drive myself home... Now with me being the typical know everything guy, I figured the best course of action was to just go to bed, get a good night's rest and all would be wonderful in the morning. Well, needless to say, part way through the night, I knew, even though still mostly in denial, that there was some quite serious crap going on within.

Now in my little brain, laying in bed, instead of thinking about my life and its importance, all I can think of is the inconvenience & cost of this event... it's important to mention that I have ended up without health Ins.... Having not actually slept, the next morning I was on the phone to my primary doctor's office before he was ever open, rushed through the office, and an EKG later, he was rather insistent that I go immediately to Community Hospital ER., Still thinking about dollars, asked if going to the County Hospital would be cheaper, he responded "probably"... I already wasted all night in hours and now was working on the morning. I convinced a friend to get me to County in Moreno Valley. This is the point of the story my learning curve became absolutely full of "hey, stupid, what were you thinking?"

I got to County with paperwork from my doctor, asking for EKG tests and monitoring. Took about 15 minutes for them to admit and rush me to ER... The wasted money was flowing, because another EKG, 10 minutes and I was being loaded up in an ambulance for transport to Riverside Community in cardiac distress. Seems county can't address such problems. The ambulance bill alone was almost \$3,000. I wasted the better part of \$10,000 and 15 hours of time, trying to save a nickel, and knew I was still in major trouble.

It's now July 8th around 11 am and I'm at the hospital where my doctor wanted me at 7 am. Within 5 minutes of arriving at Community, I was stripped, shaved, and taken to the CAT lab, dye injected, angioplasty done, and had 2 stents installed. All my pain appeared gone and things were looking up - I remember thinking that this was way too easy. Taken to ICU and monitored for 2 days. All seemed right with the world, all tests, total lack of discomfort by myself, and able to walk around the ICU effortlessly...my heart doctor sent me to a regular room July 11th and scheduled me for release the following day July 12th,,,with 20 minutes to go I was delighted to say the least. Well, at that point the bottom completely fell out of my world. I spun around on my heels 180 degrees and took a few large steps across the hospital room, kicking my now open veined heart into high gear... I felt dizzy, went for the bed but didn't make it, collapsed, fortunately for me, a friend was there and screamed for help! My next memory was a nurse slapping the hell out of me, yelling "sir, sir, can you hear me?", with someone else trying to get tubes down my throat, then only one word spoken very clear & loud - "Clear!". Holy blankety..blankety..blank...the defibulators we see in the movies, let's just say they are not a factual re-creation. In fact, the human body reacts poorly to electric shock and they are merely getting out of the way of flying parts, i.e., arms, legs. I was taken back to ICU, shocked again, then the better part of 12 hours getting me stabilized. I remember the shocks. The outright fear. Not being able to breathe...the medical community says that very few people are conscious and aware of the defibulator's effects... I will NEVER forget those little shining paddles! Enough said on this subject.

The following day, there were 2 different conversations that came at me... 1st was the medical community wondering what the hell just happened, and 2nd, was that a friend and OFRT member was now in ICU on the same floor with similar problems. For me it was back to the CAT lab, re-injected the dye, and recheck all their earlier repairs. The thinking was that something had moved or some such thing. All I know was something that was rather painless the first time round, wasn't on round 2. ... continued on page 23 ...continued from page 22

As for the other Old Fart, Henry H. was not doing well and there was much concern by all. I cleared with my heart doctor to visit my fellow member - he agreed it would be good for both of us. Later that day, or the next (not clear in my head), in the midst of all this chaos, was an event that will always bring a smile to me, made possible by a couple of Old Fart guys just wanting to be helpful. With my room full of visitors, in come Dave B. & Danny H., pushing a commandeered wheelchair from who knows where, with this "we're here to take you to see Henry H.". With Dave worried about all my wires and things, and Danny shooting directions, off we went, racing down hallways, passing room after room, nurses, patients, and visitors alike - all looking on with this what's going on look to their faces. Although I had clearance from my doctor, I don't think it's exactly what he had in mind...I would like to personally thank Dave & Danny for a memory that will always be cherished! This also led to a nice visit with Henry who was just as surprised as I. I've asked a lot of people, but here in print "again" would like to say to Danny H. that I just don't understand how such a dear, caring man could end up with the nickname A-Hole and be so very proud of it.

As for me, a few more days, and after many tests and pokes, they decided that an earlier heart attack, maybe 18 months earlier, had killed part of my heart muscle, and when I got excited about going home, sent me into heart arrhythmia...only medical choice for long term - full open heart surgery with a double bypass for good measure. Something later told to me by the surgeon – I was not expected to survive. With the help of some dear family and friends, got my affairs in order, said my peace with the man upstairs, said my goodbyes, and off I went. Now July 15th, 12 hours and 3 days later I woke up, I'm still here. And after another week of monitors, tests and x-rays, the medical community is optimistic about my future, I am "No" longer a smoker, and I'm home getting stronger every day. I thank all of you for the overwhelming support, the outpouring of concern on my behalf. I've spent a lot of the last 20 years trying to become a better person, a better friend. All of your reactions through this most difficult time will be remembered emotionally throughout my soul for as long as I live. To say "thank you" hardly seems enough to this Old Fart...... Looking forward to seeing all of you in the future...


Eyeballs 'n' Endmills






Welcome To All New @ld Jarts !!
